The Teacher Student Relationship

Abstract

The overall theme of this study is that the student and teacher's relationship is important to the professional development of both the preservice and inservice teacher. The meaning and nature of the experience, however, were different. Themes identified are related to (a) the purpose and outcomes of the student teaching experience, (b) the relationship between the student and teacher, and (c) the knowledge and skills of the student teacher.

Relationship Between the Student and Teacher

The Good teachers also described a professional relationship by providing support, direction or guidance related to teaching. The quality of the teacher student relationship is the single most important factor that determines success as a teacher.

A strong relationship with students is vital for classroom success so it's worth spending time and energy to get it right. Like every other aspect of classroom management it is possible for every teacher to learn the necessary strategies and techniques to build good relationships between teachers and students.
