

Industrial Visit

On Jan 22, 2009 an industrial visit organized by institute at "Mahle Megma Ltd. Pithampur". The company makes engine parts and mounts. They gave the companies description "chilled cast camshafts and valve tappets are specialized products with very high service life. Chilled cast camshafts have now replaced almost all the previously used forged steel camshafts in passenger cars. We can supply as cast, semi machined or fully machined camshafts as per requirement.

We can also convert the existing forged camshafts with the chilled cast camshafts. Unlike the forged camshafts the wear prone area's on camlobes on camshafts are hardened during the casting process it and do not need any induction hardening etc. The chilled camshafts offer low machining stocks, good lubricating properties and more consistency in hardness at the wear prone area's with high depth of hardness."

This information enhanced student's knowledge in this area. They explained perspective careers in this field. Though spare parts companies has less scope in management but this had made them able to understand this sector.

Son of Viswanath Dutta and Bhuvaneswari Devi, Swami Vivekananda had the God gifted mind power and had an extraordinary strong memory. He started practicing meditation from the very early age. Narendranath was also known as 'Bile'. He showed his mettle not only in the academic area, but also in various games including gymnasium, fencing, wrestling, rowing etc. He was also into various cultural activities, and learned instrumental and vocal music.

Narendranath got admitted to Presidency College, Calcutta in 1879, and after a year, he moved to Scottish Church College, Calcutta. He studied philosophy there. He also studied various other subjects including western logic, western philosophy, and history of European nations.

Swami Vivekananda, also known as Vivekananda, or Swamiji, was a Hindu sage who shook the whole world with his philosophy and thought, and influenced the social reforms of the 19th century India. One of the most well known spiritual gurus of India, Swami Vivekananda was an exponent of Vedanta and Yoga. Most eminent disciple of Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Swami Vivekananda played a pivotal role in the Hindu reform movements in India. This formidable spiritual leader of India founded the most well known Ramakrishna Math and the Ramakrishna Mission

All of the Asian emerging economies had developed significant defensive capabilities against a global market meltdown, mainly by virtue of their massive foreign exchange reserves, the unknown nature of global portfolio linkages prevalent today made it impossible to assess how significant the risks really were and how a relatively small shock might transmit through the system.

The developments of the last couple of weeks, during which a major French bank was rocked by its large exposures to the US sub-prime market, reinforce the sense of things being worse than they appear at first.
