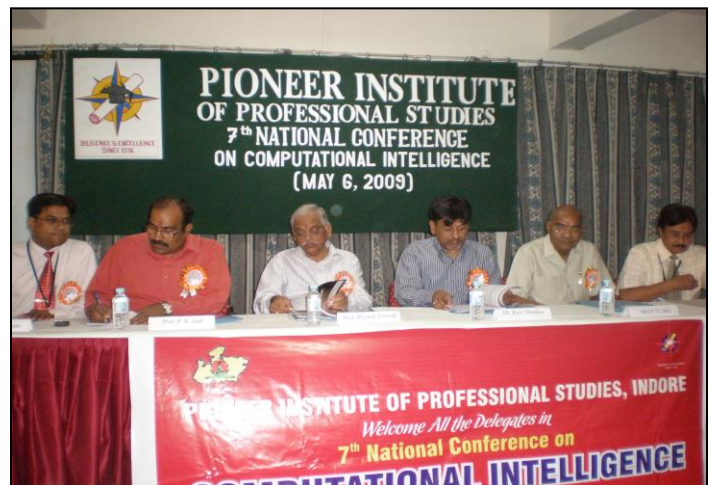

Faculty Development Activities

7th NATIONAL CONFERENCE

On 6th May 2009, Pioneer Institute organized the 7th National Conference on the theme “*Computational Intelligence*”. It had various sub themes like Data Warehousing and Data Mining, Artificial Intelligence, Web Mining and Web Application, Complex Open Distributed System, Object Oriented Data Modeling, Computational Intelligence and Multimedia, Information and Data Analysis, Interactive Digital Entertainment Technology, Software Engineering Theory and Practices, Bluetooth, Embedded System, Knowledge Management expert System, EDI and RFID, Mobile Commerce, MRP, ERP etc.

The Advisory Board of Committee composed of Dr. P. N. Mishra (Director IMS, DAVV, Indore) Prof. P.K. Jain (Chairman, Pioneer Institute of Professional Studies, Indore), Dr. M. Kumar, (Prof. Sagar Institution of Research & Technology & Ex-head (MCA) MANIT, Bhopal), Dr. A.K. Ramani (Head and Professor SCS, DAVV, Indore), Prof. D. A. Mehta, Head & Professor, Department of Computer Science, SGISTS, Indore, and Dr. Rekha Govil, Prof. & Dean, Banasthali Vidyapith, Banasthali.



The core team of the Conference was headed by Conference Chairman, Dr. V.K. Jain and further the team included Conference Secretary Vijay Kumar Verma and Conference Joint-Secretary Prof. Sadique Khan.

All together, we received 110 abstracts from 160 participants. Out of these abstracts, 105 were selected for paper presentation. We received 80 full papers for presentation from different Institutes of various states of India like Swaminarayan College of Computer Science, Bhavnagar, Gujarat, Mepco

Schlenk Engineering College, Sivakasi, Tamilnadu, BSS, Ericsson India Limited, Lucknow, College of Engineering Bhubneswar, Orissa, YMCA Institute of Engineering, Hariyana, Jagan Institute of Management Studies, Indraprastha University, Delhi to name a few.

The Conference was scheduled in 6 different sessions: the Inaugural Session, 4 Technical Sessions and Valedictory Session. Technical Sessions had the following themes: IT for Organizational Excellence, Computational Intelligence, Networking and Data Security and Data Mining and Data Warehousing.

The Inaugural session was started with Saraswati Vandana followed by welcoming note by Prof. P.K. Jain, Chairman PIPS, and Indore. Dr V.K. Jain Director (MCA) & Conference Chairman, Pioneer Institute, Indore highlighted the motive behind the conference and gave a brief idea about the conference.

Next step was released of Souvenir and e-news letter “Darpan” by Guests. The Chief Guest in the Inaugural session was Prof Piyush Trivedi Vice Chancellor, RGPV, and Bhopal. Keynote Speaker of the Conference was Prof. Ravi Shankar, Professor, IIT, New Delhi.

The first session was on topic ***“IT for Organizational Excellence”*** chaired by Dr. P. Panigrihi, Professor, IIM, Indore and co-chaired by Mr. Sunil Sahu, Director, SunRays Technology, Indore. Total 28 Paper were Scheduled in this Session out of which 7 were presented.

The second session was on topic ***“Computational Intelligence”*** chaired by Dr.S. Tokeker Professor, IET, DAVV, Indore and co-chaired by Dr. V.K. Jain, Director (MCA), PIPS, Indore. Total 26 Paper were Scheduled in this Session out of which 5 were presented.

Lunch break was organized for all the delegates after this session

The third session was on the topic ***“Networking and Data Security”*** chaired by Dr. Sursh Jain, Director, KCB Technical Academy, Indore co-chaired by Mr. Prabhat Sandiliya, Scorpio Informatics, Indore. Total 24 Paper were Scheduled in this Session out of which 7 were presented.

The fourth session was on the topic ***“Data Mining and Data Warehousing”*** chaired by Dr. Abhay Kothari, Professor & Head, Department of CSE, Truba

College of Science & Technology, Indore. Co - chaired by Mr. Amal Singh, Director, and Scorpio Informatics Indore. Total 27 Paper were scheduled in this session out of which 6 were presented.

After a Small Tea break Valedictory the last session of the conference started in which conference was read by Dr. Pawan Patni, Director (MBA), Pioneer Institute, Indore.

Special Guest for the valedictory session of the conference was Prof. H.S. Mehta, Technical Advisor, IIM, Indore who shared his wisdom on Information Technology.

SEMINARS

Autonomous Status
